PRO SHOP

By now everybody should have had a chance to meet our new PGA Professional - Jim Carlson. Jim brings a wealth of experience to the Purple Hawk. Most recently, Jim was the PGA Director of Golf at MN National in McGregor and prior to that he ran the show, as PGA General Manager, of Blueberry Pines in Menahga. Overall, Jim is bringing a new culture to the Hawk, including staff uniforms. Jim has already made many changes, including a new Point of Sale System, a new Website, increased control of cart usage & rotation, including range ball process, and a fresh new look in clothing in the Proshop. We continue to fight "supply chain issues" but the inventory is looking good and improving daily! We have had a full tournament schedule this year with several new tournaments playing at our course - the MGA Senior Tour, the US Kids Local Tour, and the MN PGA Junior Tour, etc.

bringing many new players and increasing our exposure to the golfing world! Also, thanks to Gavin Lillemoen, who has been so instrumental in many areas, Junior Golf Camp and Junior League. Plus, he is now virtually running all of our golf leagues. Thanks Gavin!

MAINTENANCE – GROUNDS CREW

Our new Superintendent (Scott Melby) and his crew have been working hard maintaining and improving our course. While there are still a few "spots" The Greens and Turf are in better shape than they have been in quite a while! As most of us remember, last year, Scott was in a serious accident coming to work one morning about a month after starting work here at The Hawk. He was laid up for most of the year after that, so this is really his first year on the job.

We have been able to support Scott by purchasing new and additional equipment, including a new lift mounted in the maintenance shed to help in maintaining the equipment, a new toro sprayer, a new John Deere zero turn Mower as well as several pieces of equipment that were purchased from Sanbrook G.C. when they closed their doors. This Spring, Scott took a greens mower that had been relegated to the Bone Yard and refurbished it, saving the course several thousand dollars a year in what would have been another piece of leased equipment - Thank You Scott!

This year has not been without its trials, as early in the year our rough mower broke and we had to wait for an extended period of time to get it fixed. The part had to come from Canada and there were supply chain issues. Several weeks ago, Scott took a census of the sprinkler heads on the course and there are 72 that do not work with the automatic controllers. This requires the maintenance crew to manually go out and turn these sprinklers on and off. We are hoping to increase the budget next year so Scott can hire somebody and dedicate him to fixing these sprinklers.

There is new sand in many of our bunkers and they are actually great to play out of. (The retired) Gary Tollifson has been a great help on special projects such as spreading and packing Crushed Granite on the cart paths. Thank You Tolly! We are hoping to bring in a Bobcat yet this year and tear out the broken-up tar leading down the hill on hole #16 and rebuild it with the crushed granite. New (100 yard) fairway markers are in place – Now if Scott can only find time to deal with the clover!

We also lost some of the Cedar rail fence lining the parking lot and golf cart staging area (3) driving range Bag Stands were damaged, (2) circuit boards in our irrigation system and the flags on the new scoreboard took a beating as well.
